

Many workers now have more time for vacations, and they have more options for their vacation time. However, a global study of workers shows that not all of them take their vacations. Many workers just keep working. They do not use all of the vacation days that they have earned on their job.

Even when some people do take a vacation, they often keep working during their vacation. They answer their e-mail, or they call their office to check on their work. They do this because they are afraid something important might happen during their vacation. They do not want to miss anything. They cannot completely relax and enjoy their leisure time. Many workers say that it is too stressful to take a long vacation. When they return to work, they have to catch up on all of the work that they did not do when they were on vacation. This means they have to work even harder.

Some people are also afraid their bosses will think they are not good workers if they take a vacation. However, research shows that most workers feel better after they return from a vacation. They return to the office with new ideas and lots of energy. Workers who spend time away from the office and relax are better workers. Some companies understand this. They require their employees to take a vacation. Workers are not allowed to check their e-mail or cell phones while they are away.

In the 1990s, many Okinawans were living to 100 years old. Health researchers from around the world flocked to* Okinawa to find out why Okinawans were living so long. The first thing most researchers looked at was the Okinawan diet. They found Okinawans ate a lot of fruit, vegetables, fish, seaweed and *tofu*. However, many researchers believed (1) it was more than just diet that made Okinawans healthy. They found that older Okinawans were physically active, still farming and gardening. Other researchers felt that perhaps the biggest reason for Okinawans' good health was their rich social (2) lives. Okinawan families were generally big, and (3) relatives lived nearby, and there were frequent family gatherings that were fun and festive*. Older Okinawans had also maintained lifelong (4) relationships with friends and neighbors, and they lived in communities where people met often and helped each other.

Studies from other countries also ₍₅₎ <u>confirmed</u> that good relations with family, friends, and the community were important for health. A study by Professor Robin Dunbar at Oxford University found that men who often met their friends were much healthier than those who stayed home. He claimed that men had to meet their friends at least twice a week to stay healthy. He ₍₆₎ <u>recommended</u> that men play sports or go to the pub and drink beer twice a week because doing so would improve their health.

Perhaps the most ₍₇₎ <u>significant</u> study ever done began at Harvard University in 1938. ₍₈₎ <u>The study</u> closely followed 268 male graduates from Harvard. The men came from a variety of backgrounds, and detailed personal information was collected on them for about 70 years. George Vaillant published the results in 2012. The conclusion was clear: love is the most important thing for health and happiness. The healthiest and happiest men had positive relationships with their families, friends, associates, and communities. It was also clear that relationships from childhood onward were very important. Men who had good relationships with their mothers when they were young were much more likely to succeed professionally and were much less likely to develop dementia* in old age. Although the study involved men only, it most certainly (9) to women as well.
